
ARNOLD O. BECKMAN RESEARCHES THE SOURCE OF THE SMOG






Dr. Beckman began by organizing research studies to characterize the chemical composition of smog as a first step to understanding the sources of the pollution.



He enlisted the help of Caltech scientist Arie Haagen-Smit, who specialized in the measurement of odors given off by foods and plants by separating the chemical components of air samples.









The results of their research studies showed the cause of smog was largely due to uncombusted hydrocarbons combined with oxygen radicals in the atmosphere, and the primary source of these hydrocarbons was car exhaust fumes.
